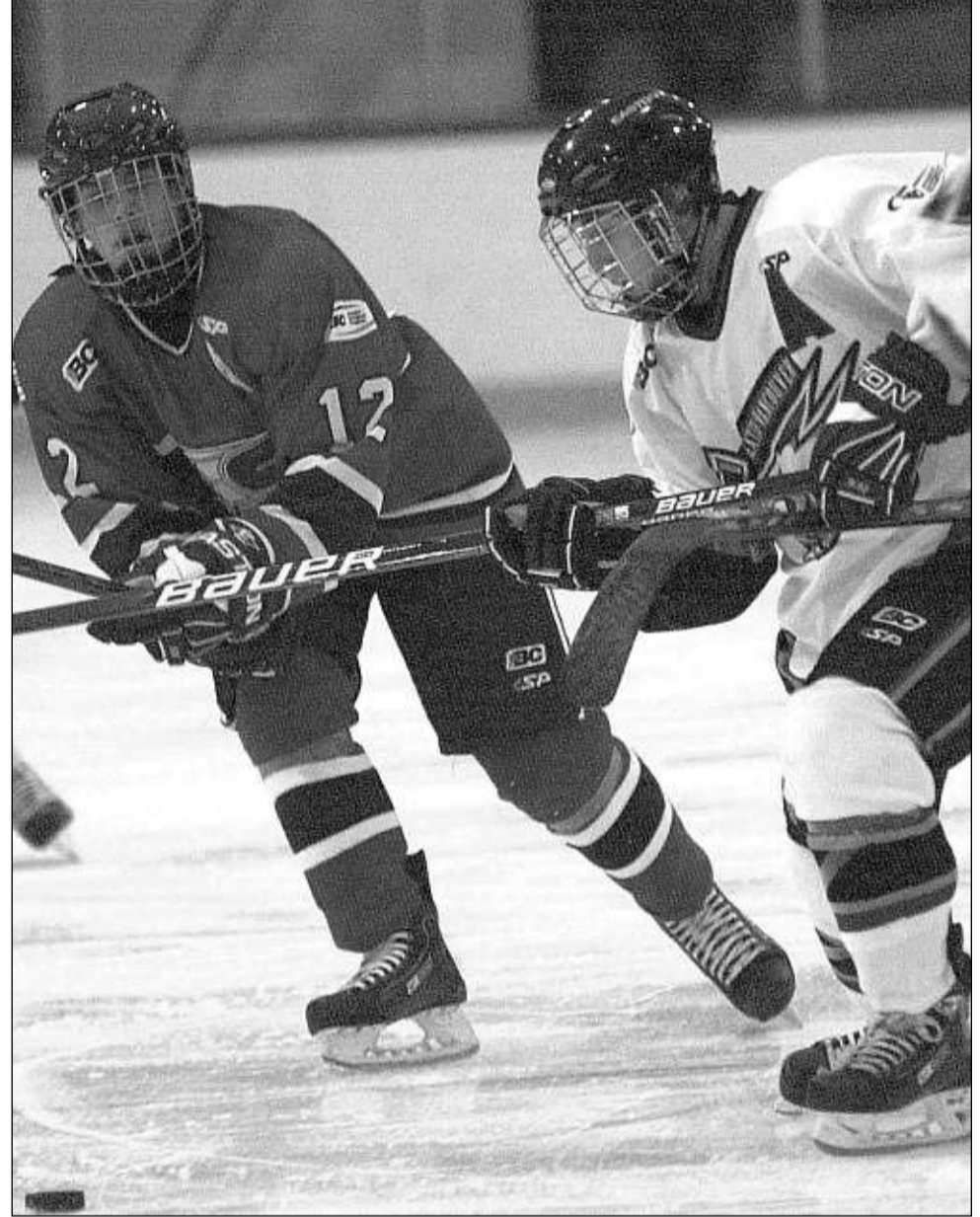
Flames play Delta tonight

X-treme victory

The GEU U21 X-treme had been beaten in one game this season and had a record of one win, one loss and three ties heading into Sunday's game with the North Coquitlam Xtreme - and improved their record to 2-1-3 after beating North Coquitlam 2-1. During the five games prior to Sunday, the opposition had scored only two goals against a very stingy defence and superb goalkeeping.

The GEU X-treme started very slowly and the defence got trapped early when the ball was passed to the GEU defenders at the midfield line and a North Coquitlam player picked it up on the run. The player managed to get to the penalty area before she could be stopped by the defender but the resulting tackle was considered a foul by the referee. The North Coquitlam player was awarded a penalty kick and made sure it rippled the back of the net.

Except for that one slip the GEU defenders played X-treme-ly well for the rest of the game. Keeper Morgan Meys continued to play well in net and made several good stops throughout the first half. At the end of the half the score was 1-0 for North Coquitlam. The X-treme took to the pitch in the second half determined to draw even with North Coquitlam. The X-treme's centre midfielders Kassie Ballard and Julie Ius increased the tempo of their

game and made numerous great passes up the sidelines. With 15 minutes gone in the half the X-treme moved the ball into North Coquitlam's penalty area. The X-treme had several chances to score from the melee but were not rewarded with a goal. North Coquitlam, in desperation, finally kicked the ball of the field giving the X-treme a corner kick. Alyssia Scales came forward from her defence position and landed the ball in front of the net. Again the X-treme had several chances to score and were not to be denied as the ball popped up and Stefanie Ekeli headed the ball past the keeper for the tying score.

For the next 15 minutes the X-treme became a little complacent but regained their composure and took over the play in the last 15 minutes of the game. Again the X-treme had a number of good chances to score but did not capitalize on them. With only five minutes remaining, Ekeli standing on her own side of midfield found herself unchecked. A pass made by the midfielder found Ekeli on the dead run towards the net. The keeper came off her line to block any shot but Ekeli simply stepped around the keeper and calmly put the ball into the net.

The X-treme continued to defend well for the last five minutes to keep the score at 2-1 and now move into a tie for third place in the league.

Ridge lacrosse players selected to elite teams

Maple Ridge lacrosse players Andrew Gresham, Lyndon Knuttila, Mateo Le Van, Jarek Olah, Brad Rowbotham and Sam Weselowski have been selected to the Burnaby Mountain Lacrosse Elite Development Program Teams.

Entering the program's sixth season, SFU men's lacrosse co-coaches Jeff Cathrea and Brent Hoskins continue to build one of Canada's top field lacrosse development programs, combining excellence on the field with academic achievement. Burnaby Mountain will field six travel teams this fall. In total, 111 student-athletes from 20 different communities across Brit-

ish Columbia and one U.S.-born athlete will represent the selects at top tournaments in California, Florida, Maryland, North Carolina and exhibition games in Portland and Seattle.

Founded in 2006, the Burnaby Mountain Selects program is designed to follow the same collegiate template as the Simon Fraser University men's lacrosse program with the objective of best preparing young student-athletes to play at the NCAA or MCLA collegiate level.

The U12 and U13 fall season will consist of one on-field practice and the opportunity to attend a

supervised study hall each week. The 11-week program will also feature a trip to Seattle on Nov. 15 and to Portland from Nov. 28 to 29 for exhibition contests versus regional all-star teams. The U12 and U13 Selects will conclude their season with a trip to San Diego, Calif. from January 14 to 18 to compete at the Adrenaline Challenge against top middle school and youth teams.

Burnaby Mountain's high-school-aged teams will practice on-field twice a week and attend three hours of weekly study hall.

In addition to an eight-week practice schedule, each team will compete in two top college recruit-

ing tournaments throughout North America. Each tournament will feature elite high-school-aged competition from across the continent in addition to the opportunity to play in front of NCAA and MCLA College Coaches.

The freshmen and sophomore selects will kick off the 2009 fall season with a trip to North Carolina from Oct. 29 to Nov. 2 to compete in the Charlotte Fall Classic. While in North Carolina, the Selects will also tour the campuses of NCAA Division I lacrosse powers North Carolina and Duke.

The following weekend, November 5-9, the junior and senior

selects will travel to Baltimore, Md. to compete in the National Recruiting Fall Ball Festival. The trip will also include a day-trip to Washington, D.C. and a tour of the United States Naval Academy (NCAA Division I).

November 19-23, the sophomore and junior teams will return to Baltimore, Md. to compete in the Ultimate Performance Lacrosse Fall Shootout. In addition to the two-day tournament, the selects will tour the campuses of Loyola University (NCAA Division I) and nine-time NCAA Division I national champion, Johns Hopkins University.
