Soccer star top player for fifth time

Christine Sinclair was named the Canadian Soccer Association female player of the year for the fifth consecutive year.

Sinclair led the FC Gold Pride with six goals, tied for fifth-best in the league, in the inaugural season of Women's Professional Soccer.

The Burnaby product was a WPS player of the week and was also selected to the year-end all-star team. At the all-star game,

Sinclair scored a pair of second-half goals in a 4-2 win over Umeå IK.

At the international level, Sinclair tallied four goals in seven games, leading Canada in goals for the ninth time in the past 10 seasons.

Sinclair is Canada's all-time leader with 99 goals and is tied with Andrea Neil with 132 career appearances. She is also the country's all-time leader in total minutes played.

Burnaby field hockey player Gabriel Ho-Garcia was named to the Canada under-17 boys' team to the Pan-American Youth Games in Hermosillo, Mexico Feb. 6 to 14, 2010. Winners qualify through to the World Youth Olympics in Singapore later in the year.

The Burnaby Mountain Selects junior team posted a winning record at the national recruiting Fall Ball field lacrosse tournament in Baltimore, Maryland Nov. 7 and 8.

St. Thomas More student Jamie Spagnuolo, Aidan Yonge of Moscrop and New Westminster Secondary students Anthony Malcom, Jonathan Rachfall and Reese Robinson helped the junior team post a 3-2-1 record in the two-day tournament against top U.S. teams from the Eastern seaboard.
