# 'Bellies sweep 'Rocks

The New Westminster Salmonbellies are on their way to a third consecutive Mann Cup.

The Salmonbellies made short work of the Victoria Shamrocks, dispatching the Western Lacrosse Association regular season runner-up in four straight games in the playoff final series Tuesday.

New Westminster made no mistake of its intentions, scoring nine goals in the opening period en route to a 17-8 victory over the 'Rocks at Bear Mountain Arena.

Playoff MVP Jordan Hall counted a first-period hat trick, while first star rookie Alex Gajic led all scorers with five goals and eight total points.

Matt Roik took the third game star with a 44-save performance for the 'Bellies.

"We had a great start. We jumped all

over them," said Salmonbellies head coach Bob Salt.

The quick 9-2 deficit led to Victoria pulling its goaltender for an extra attacker throughout the match in an attempt to play catchup.

That created a lot of five-on-six situations for the New Westminster defence that was both frustrating to play against but helpful in preparing for what's to come at the Mann in Ontario, said Salt.

"We're going East and we had a lot of practice with our zone. Everyone on our D-end can play it now," he said. "We really played."

Ilija Gajic, with a seven-point night, Jordan McBride and Cliff Smith with four-point outings, all scored added two goals apiece to the 'Bellie win.

The Mann Cup will take place on Sept. 10 at the home of the Ontario series winner, either Peterborough or Brampton.

## Laker star re-signs with Stealth

Burnaby Laker Cam Sedgwick recently re-signed with the National Lacrosse League champion Washington Stealth.

Sedgwick, an assistant captain with the Stealth last season and scorer of the game-winning goal over the Toronto Rock in the championship final, will be entering his 10th pro season and seventh with the Stealth franchise.

The former Minto Cup MVP in 1998 and two-time Western Lacrosse Association MVP had a career-best 23 goals and 63 points in 2009.

Sedgwick recorded 22 goals and 58 points last season, while garnering 11 points in three playoff games in 2010.

# Selects even at Champ camp

The senior Burnaby Mountain Selects finished the recent Champ camp in Baltimore, Maryland with a .500 record.

The Burnaby Mountain elite team, including Tyler Buchan and Jamie Spagnuolo of Burnaby and Connor Goodwin from New Westminster, finished with a record of 4-4 at the high school boys' field lacrosse tournament that drew 69 of the top programs in North America to the invitation-only national championship.

The Selects are the first program from Western Canada to be selected in the tournament's 21-year history.

Burnaby Mountain opened with a 10-1 win over the Hot Shots from Maryland but finished divisional play with a 1-3 record, dropping out of title contention on a head-to-head tiebreaker.

The B.C. team rallied with a 3-1 record in the consolation round with wins over Massachusetts, Virginia and New Jersey, despite playing in extreme heat.
