Riley Glemnitz, was one of the sophomore boys lacrosse players who travelled down to San Diego, California the first weekend of January to wrap up their 2010 fall season with the Adrenaline Challenge. Co-head coach, Brent Hoskins said the team had a great tournament.

They posted a 4-1 record in the South Swell High School Division, with their only loss coming at the hands of the eventual champion, FCA SoCal Blue from California.

Glemnitz was one of five Mountain players who were chosen to compete in an All-Star game on Sunday, Jan. 9. Only the top players in each division are selected.

This Adrenaline tournament itself consists of over 80 teams from four divisions, and Hoskins said it is largely considered to be the western club lacrosse championship.

Despite having only a single loss, the BMS Sophomores would be eliminated from the Top 8 Play-off Bracket on a tie breaker. Undeterred by their exclusion, the Selects would go on to win their remaining challenge matches defeating Golden Gate U16 Gold (12-2) and All Idaho (12-4) to finish 4-1 on the weekend.

After two days of competition, the Selects took some time to enjoy the sunny San Diego weather as they visited Pacific Beach and Mission Beach to take in the Ocean Front Boardwalk.
