## Baryla banks \$68K payday

Vernon's Chris Baryla bagged \$68,000 in the \$6 million PGA Tour's Greenbrier Classic in Sulphur Springs, W. Va.

Baryla, 28, carded a 3-under 67 Sunday after shooting 72 Saturday at the Old White TCP course.

The VSS Panther and Texas-El Paso Miners grad finished in a nine-way tie for 18th place. Canadian David Hearn also ended up at 5-under 275.

Baryla, who made his first cut this season, recorded nines of 32 and 35 Sunday, earning an eagle three on the par-5 12th hole. He averaged 313 yards per drive for the four rounds.

Scott Stallings of Worcester, Ma. made a birdie on the final hole to qualify for a three-way playoff, then sprinted in excitement toward the 18th tee and showed he could repeat the feat on the first extra hole.

The PGA Tour rookie sank a 7-footer for birdie on the 168-yard hole to beat Bob Estes and Bill Haas. After watching Estes and Haas miss longer birdie attempts on the first extra hole, Stallings curled in his putt for his first tour victory. He flipped his putter, then hugged and high-fived his caddie.

The 26-year-old Stallings is the 10th first-time winner on the PGA Tour this year and the sixth rookie to do it.

Stallings overcame a tough start and made six birdies on the back nine to gain the playoff, where he earned a winner's check worth \$1.08 million and a spot in the Bridgestone Invitational.

Estes and Haas each earned \$528,000. Haas earned his fourth top-10 finish of the season and improved to 12th in the FedEx standings.

The 45-year-old Estes missed out on his first tour win since 2002. Estes sat out the first three months of the year with a wrist injury and was playing in just his seventh tournament.

Estes, playing with a respiratory illness, shot 6-under 64 and was the clubhouse leader at 10 under, then found out Haas birdied the par-5 17th six groups later to join him after a 67.

## Nationals field local trio

Coldstream's Ryan Landels is hoping fourth time is a charm.

After three straight silver medals at the Canadian Field Lacrosse Championships, the Kalamalka Laker grad would like nothing more than to hoist the First Nations Cup this year at the Under 19 tournament, Sept. 2-4 in Burnaby.

"We've come second every year (to Ontario). We'd like to win gold for a change," smiled Landels, a goalie.

"The Prairies are getting better, but it's up in the air between B.C. and Ontario."

Landels will be joined on the Team B.C. in Burnaby by Coldstream's Bayne Bosquet, who is making his debut at nationals, as is Vernon's Ryan Sarazin, who will compete with the B.C. squad for the U16 Alumni Cup.

Landels, who turns 19 in September, is out in Alberta working on the oil fields. He also plays defence/transition in box lacrosse with the Edmonton Eclipse of the Alberta junior A league.

He learned about the league from a friend after moving to Edmonton, and they both tried out together.

"He got cut and I made it," grinned Landels, who is still unable to pick a favourite between field and box.

"They're totally different; you can't compare the two. I love them both and I'm playing what I love year-round."

Landels recalls earning field lacrosse goaltending duty by default as a 15-year-old.

"I started playing goal because no one else would, and I turned out to be half decent at it and here I am now," he smiled.

Landels plans to try out for Team Canada, with the hopes of playing at the 2012 World Championships in Helsinki, Finland.

Bosquet, who played junior B box with the Vernon Re/Max Tigers and field with the North Okanagan Legends, is looking forward to testing his skills against high-calibre competition in the Burnaby tourney.

"I think it'll be a good test to go out

there and see what I got. You get to play with the best in Canada, so that's exciting," said Bosquet, a defender.

Like Landels and Sarazin, Bosquet attended the Burnaby Mountain Selects field lacrosse development program, operated by head coach Brent Hoskins, who is also co-head coach of the Simon Fraser University Clan men's team.

Bosquet has travelled with Selects touring teams to North American tournaments in Baltimore, New York and San Diego.

"Overall, the coaching there is just fantastic. It's a great atmosphere to go and learn our skills. If you surround yourself with better players you just step your game up all around," said Bosquet.

Sarazin recently returned from a tour with the Selects to New York State where his junior elite squad went 1-4-1 at the Syracuse

University Summer Shootout.

The 16-year-old Fulton student says it was a big opportunity to showcase his skills in front of scouts.

"It's a lot of coaches, anywhere from 60 to 80. It's a big recruiting time in the summer. I've gotten some looks, and I'm definitely looking to receive something," said Sarazin, who got to tour the Big Apple after the tourney, including stops at Ground Zero, Battery Park and NBC Studios.

Sarazin, a midfielder and faceoff specialist who plays box and field with the North Okanagan A2 Legends, says the process of earning a spot on Team B.C. has been a long one.

In the last year, he has counted nearly 20 trips to the Lower Mainland for tryouts and practice with the Selects and B.C. programs.

"At first it's a long drive, but after three
